It is with regret that the Friends of Longcroft School announce that a meeting to discuss and arrange dissolution of the charity will be held on Tuesday December 11th, 7pm in the Board Room at Upper School.

Falling membership numbers and lack of support have left the charity without the required number of trustees to continue.

Should any parent, grandparent, relative, friend, governor or staff member from the Longcroft community feel they are able to contribute a small amount of time to keep the charity from folding, please join us at the meeting to prevent the dissolution.

The charity has supported the students and work of the school for over 34 years. Over that time a substantial amount of money has been raised, which has contributed to projects for the young people of our community. Last year alone saw donations of over £5,000 support items, projects and initiatives that would otherwise not be afforded.

A tiny number of parents have been the mainstay of the charity over the last few years and as their children move on from Longcroft we are left with an empty committee room.
